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Messages

It is with a sense of pride, and also deep appreciation that I congratulate the Management, the Principal, all the Staff and Students of the Jamshed & Shirin Guzder English Medium School on the occasion of the release of the first edition of their School Magazine – GEMS.

Shri. Jamshedji Guzder, the former Chairman of the Sir C.J. New High School Trust, concerned as he was with how globalization would impact Indian education, had long advocated the need to establish an English Medium School to complement the existing Primary, Boys and Girls Schools on the campus. The Jamshed & Shirin Guzder English



Medium School was established in the year 2000 with Jamshedji as the sole donor, hence the name. When Jamshedji, finished his schooling his father did not let him to complete his university education, and after an initial 2 years in college pulled him into the family business. Jamshedji – my father – had four children and he often said that "…even though I may not be able to leave you rich, I shall ensure that you have the best education that I can afford, so that you will always be able to make your way successfully in life".

Today 16 years later, this School, even in the face of strong competition, has established a sound reputation for quality education. Jamshedji, if alive today, would have been a year short of his 100 birthday and would have felt justly rewarded to see the seed he planted blossoming into a splendid and impressive tree.

Let me however, emphasize that whereas the students bring in the accolades, these are the results of what has been carefully and caringly imparted over the years. Education here is built not just on the pillars of the 3 Rs (reading, 'riting, 'rithmetic) but also the 3 Hs (hand, heart, head). The intellectual aspect is balanced by sport – indoors and outdoors – and yoga, all of which combined, makes the whole child a complete adult.

Here the teacher's intellectual inputs are interwoven with ethical aspects, and must strive to touch the whole child. Knowledge must be tempered with values – the latter has been on the lines of the teachings of Mahatma Gandhi and Swami Vivekananda sustaining our Indian heritage, but in today's increasingly global context, we should also try to be inclusive of the best of the heritage values of other cultures, and respect their cultural and religious diversity.

Our regular Staff meetings help to continually upgrade the quality of our curricular inputs and provide an intellectual environment where discourse and debate work to foster knowledge skills and a good shared vision. This in turn can be overtly or subtly communicated to the student. In every school there is for every child at least one teacher whose impact on that child remains always, and is based on a feeling of trust. For this reason teachers must endeavour to ensure that their vision, skills, attitudes and encouragement continually nurture this feeling of trust.

Our School upholds gender equity in both academics as well as in co-curricular activities. We are delighted when our girls as much as our boys make a mark at the District and State levels in sports, and when they display their talents in science exhibitions, which are held regularly (the Iken Labs and e-classes have provided a considerable upgrade). I personally have also seen many a cultural programme put up by not just the English Medium School but all the Schools, and the high standards are impressive.

I believe that those of us who have and will benefit from their education must not forget the less privileged. The Khimji aided Scholarship Fund is a step in this direction, but it is for each of you – the Students – to also reach out a helping hand.

Our Principal and teachers unfailingly supported by the Management have over the years strived to touch not just the minds of the students but also their spirit to "raise" citizens who will be examples of integrity, tolerance, wisdom and compassion.

The Jamshed and Shirin Guzder English Medium School was started under the aegis of the Sir C. J. New High School Trust, Gandevi in the year 2000. It is our proud privilege today to welcome you to the first issue of our school's annual magazine – 'GEMS'. The magazine is about the essence of GEMS – Guzder English Medium School. We are celebrating sixteen years of our existence.

There were already three schools flourishing under the aegis of the Trust in the 1990s. Due to



globalization, proficiency in English became essential. There was only one English medium School in the neighbouring town of Bilimora. It was difficult for children to commute to Bilimora. The school was named after him and his wife, The Jamshed and Shirin Guzder English Medium School. In the year 2000 the English Medium School was started. Mr. Jamshedji Guzder promised that his family will support the school. Till date the family has generously provided financial support to the school.

With a modest beginning in 2000 with 99 students and 6 class rooms, The Guzder English Medium School began its journey and has established itself into a full fledged School with a Difference and Dedication. The journey continued, classes and strength of the school increased and The Guzder English Medium School expanded into a distinct school of excellence catering to the needs of more than 1100 students at present. We have classes from Playgroup to Std XII Commerce. A staff of 46 teachers and 12 non teaching staff members caters to the needs of the students.

The school is situated amidst lush green orchards. A beautiful garden adorns the entrance of the school. There is a large playground for the students to play. A total of 26 classrooms, 2 multipurpose halls, a library, a science lab, a computer lab, a dining hall, a kitchen with modern equipments, R.O. 

A Tribute to

Shree Jamshedji Guzder



Charity is a supreme virtue,

And the great channel through which the mercy of God is passed on to mankind. It is the virtue that unites men and inspires their noblest efforts. – Conrad Hilton

A committed philanthropists and great lover of the Parsi community!

Jamshedji was a son of the Parsi community, a Samaritan for the needy, a follower of the zarthusth religion. A successful businessman with a jovial nature, that is Jamshedji Guzder. He proved his worth by working with industrialists like the Tata, Birla, Wadia, Larsen and Tubro, and DHL Groups. He has also been the president of All India Chamber of Commerce three times.

Jamshedji was the fifth son of Nasarwanji Sorabji Guzder, born on 5/2/1917. His mother Gulbanu greatly admired Jamshedji Tata and named her son Jamshed wishing him to become a successful person just like his namesake.

The Guzder family was in the cotton business since 1907. After the demise of his father, Jamshedji took over the management of this business in 1934. He was chosen as the 'Cotton Merchant Agent' by the Swadeshi mill of the Tata group and the Bombay Dyeing mill of the Wadia group. Then after, he served as the 'Clearing Agent' and 'Transporting Agent' of the Taj Hotel and the Tata Electric Power Supply Company. From the age of 18 to 60 years, he has been the Director of various companies.

In the Farsi language a person who keeps a measuring stick in his hand is called 'Guzder'. Jamshedji's father and grandfather used to measure the wood from the Waghai-Dang area of Gujarat. They resided in Gandevi which was situated on the banks of the Ambika river. The Parsis of this region associated with this profession were known as Guzder.

Jamshedji firmly followed Gandhiji's principle of Trusteeship. In 1990, a Parsi Lady gave Jamshedji the responsibility of managing her property of 2.5 crores and using it for charity. Thereafter he also received Rs. 26 crores by selling the shares of the Parsi Lady. He divided the money and formed Trusts for Parsis and other Public Trusts for the proper management of the funds for public welfare. He firmly believed that 'Charity begins at home'.

He served the Parsi community as the President of the Parsi Panchayat for three decades. He became the 'Chairman Emirates' of the Parsi community. He formed his family Trust in the name of the 'Jamshed Shirin Trust'. A large part of the profit from the family business was used through this Trust for Charity.

Jamshedji's wife Shirinbanu was always supportive in his charity work. He has a daughter Statira and two sons Cyrus and Farookh. Jamshedji has given a noteworthy contribution in the progress of his native Gandevi. He has served as the Chairman of the Sir C.J. New High School Trust and played a vital role in the progress of the institute. He has provided financial support to the Trust and has been the sole donor for the English Medium School which has been given name The Jamshed and Shirin Guzder English Medium School, after him and his wife. He ensured continuous support to the schools from his Family Trust after his demise too. His daughter, Dr. Statira Wadia is the Chairperson of the Trust.

Jamshedji Guzder has always been an exemplary person. His love towards this institution, his generous and loving nature, his intellectual personality is unparalleled. The following lines stand true for Jamshedji.....

Teachers' Prayer Session

Our teachers start their day half an hour before their students. It has been a tradition in our school since the commencement of the school. The teachers gather and pray together. After the prayer, we conduct activities like reading and discussion of articles which may be value based, related to teaching, yoga, solving puzzles or riddles.

Students' Assembly

Every morning the day starts with the students' assembly. The assembly starts with the National song 'Vande mataram' followed by Omkar, shlok recitation, prayer, reading the news and a good thought, Pledge. Every Friday the students have mass drill.

Kids are like clay, they mould the way you carve them. They learn the best when they are small and when taught differently. For making a beautifully carved vase, the artisan has to delicately handle the vase. Same way to teach the small children, innovative and lucid patterns should be introduced. The same concept is followed by the teachers of our school.

Parts of the body



"Head, Shoulders, Knees and toes, Knees and toes......"

The best way to teach the students the common concepts is through sing-along pattern. Rhymes related to the body parts are sung with actions while the students learned about the different body parts. Pictures of parts of the body are shown and actions for each body part are demonstrated and explained. The numbers 1 to 10 are also incorporated in this topic for eg. 1 nose, 2 eyes, 2 hands, 10 fingers etc.

Animals

The topic of 'Animals' is always a fun and interesting topic for the students to learn. The students are shown pictures of domestic as well as wild animals. To make it even more exciting, the students were taken to the zoo. As their knowledge of animals got more concrete, an activity was done where in the students had to go to the correct group of animals. Their excitement reached no boundaries when they saw an elephant in the school premises. Apart from these models, masks are made and various milk products are also shown. Students participate in yet another activity where they wear the mask of an animal and speak 2-3 lines about it.





Fruits and Vegetables.









Fruits and vegetables are primary and necessary items in a balanced diet. To make the topic fun and exciting a fancy dress program was conducted. We also, invite fruit sellers and vegetable vendors in the school premises. To make the topic 'Fruits' more clear, the students are told to bring one fruit everyday for one week. For the topic 'Vegetables', a chart is sent home where in the children write the name of the vegetable they eat for the whole week. The students are also taken to visit the local vegetable market.

Vehicles





Vehicles are mode of transportation which takes you from place A to place B. These means of transportation are taught to them by showing them models of roadways, airways, waterways and railways. To make the topic more thrilling the children are taken to the gate of the campus where they see and identify the passing vehicles. Rhymes about vehicles are sung to make the topic even more enjoyable.

Flowers









Roses, Lily, Marigold, Lotus....... The topic 'Flowers' is introduced to them through a "Flower Exhibition" where the little buds get to see both real and artificial flowers. Artifacts made from flowers such as garlands, bouquet and rangolis etc are shown. Things made from the fragrances of flowers such as perfume, incense sticks etc are displayed in the exhibition. To make this beautiful topic more intriguing, a fancy dress competition is held.

Birds

Children are always fascinated by birds. Their captivating body, their enthralling flight and their soothing chirps. The students are taken for a nature walk to observe and identify the birds. Colours







Imagine the horror if our lives were like the old eras black and white televisions! Vibrant and beautiful colours make human life more enchanting and exciting. Colour week is celebrated dedicating a day to each colour. The Pre-primary premises are decked up in the specific colour with balloons, ribbons and other decorative items. To make the experience more beautiful, all the children along with the teachers come dressed up in the particular colour. Red day, Blue day, Green day, Yellow day and Black-White day are the days celebrated.

Our Helpers









Our community helpers are the people whose help is significant but whose efforts are hardly appreciated. To bring in awareness about all the helpers around, the students are taken to town and are introduced to different helpers like sweeper, postman, doctor, barber, farmer, gardener, cobbler etc. As an activity, a fancy dress competition is held where in the students dress up as different helpers. To make the topic more interesting the teachers dress up as various helpers and present an act. The students have to guess the helper.

Seasons and Sky Objects

Change in climate and clothing shows the change in the season. The topic season is elaborated by describing the season and explaining the clothing worn, food eaten during the particular season. The students are selected from the ninth standard and are given a scholarship for the following year. A committee of teachers monitors them over the year and the final selection is done on the basis of a personal interview.

Underprivileged Student's Scholarship

These scholarships help address the educational needs of children coming from impoverished and disadvantaged socio-economic family backgrounds. Priority here is given to single parent households. Parents of scholarship receiving students are required to give their time to help in non-teaching school activities.

The project has received enormous support from other donors too. Due to the immense support we are now able to provide scholarships to underprivileged students of all four schools under the aegis of the Sir C.J. New High School Trust.



Glorifying our Cultural Heritage



ગુજરાતી મારી માતૃભાષા

આપણી સંસ્કૃતિ કોઈ ધર્મ કે જાતિની નહીં પરંતુ આપણા ભારતીય હોવાની ધોતક છે. કોઈપણ સંસ્કૃતિના ચાર સ્તંભ હોય છે - રાષ્ટ્રવાદ, આચાર-વિચાર, પરંપરા અને ભાષા.

ઉ<mark>પરોક્ત ચારેચ પરિબળો રથના ચાર</mark> પૈંડાઓ સમાન હોય છે. જેમાં સૌથી અતુલ્ય પરિબળ છે. 'ભાષા'



માતૃભાષા એક એવું વટવૃક્ષ છે કે જેનાં દ્વારા નિરંતર આપણને જ્ઞાનરૂપી એનાં ફળ પ્રાપ્ય થતાં જ હોય છે. જીવનની સાચી સમજણનું પ્રથમ સોપાન માતૃભાષા પાસેથી જ ગ્રહણ થાય છે. વ્યક્તિને તેની પોતાની ભાષા તેના બાલ્યાવસ્થાથી લઈને વૃદ્ધાવસ્થાના મધ્યકાળમાં જીવન જીવવાની સાચી કળા અને જ્ઞાનનો સંચાર અર્પે છે. અને તે થકી વ્યક્તિ પોતાની સામર્થ્યતા અને બુદ્ધિમતાનો પરિચય સમાજ ને આપે છે.

માતૃભાષા પરિપક્વ સમાજ માટે પાચાસમાન છે. જો સંસ્કૃતિ પ્રાણ છે તો ભાષા એ સંસ્કૃતિનો ઇબકાર છે. એટલે જ તો સાહજિક્તા અને હૃદયની ભીની મૃદુતાથી બોલાચેલા કર્ણપ્રિય ભાષાકીય શબ્દોનો રસથાળ કોઈપણ મનુષ્યના અંતરની તૃષાને તૃષ્તિથી ભરી દે છે. ભાષા એટલે માનવીના અંતરમાં ઇરોબાચેલા તેની વિચારધારનો પહેરવેશ. માતૃભાષાના મહત્વ ને આલેખતાં એટલું કહેવું જરૂરી છે કે : ''આપણી માતૃભાષા લુપ્ત થાય તેની અંતિમ કડી આપણે ન બનીએ. આપણે ભાષાને નહિ; આપણી જાતને, સંસ્કારિતાને બચાવવાની છે. ભાષાનું મૃત્યુ એટલે આપણી સંસ્કૃતિનું મૃત્યુ. અને સંસ્કૃતિનું મૃત્યુ એટલે એવું મૃત્યુ કે જેમાં સ્મશાને જવાનું ફરિયાત નથી.''

માતૃભાષા ક્યારેય કોઈ વ્યક્તિના અસ્તિત્વ માટે આડખીલીરૂપ બની નથી. વ્યક્તિના કોઈપણ કાર્ચ શરૂ કરવા પાછળ ભાષા અવરોધરૂપ થતી નથી. કહેવું અહીં યોગ્ય છે કે વ્યક્તિની કાબેલિયત અને તેની કોઠાસૂઝ તેને સફળતા તરફ દોરી જાય છે. વ્યક્તિની કાર્યક્ષમતા, સમર્થતા અને સક્ષમતા હોય તો તેના વિકાસમાં કોઈપણ ભાષા ક્યારેય નડતી નથી. કંઈ કેટલાંય સૈકાઓ બદલાય ગયા પરિવર્તન આવ્યું, જ્ઞાનનું ક્ષેત્ર પૂર્વથી પશ્ચિમ બન્યું. અભ્યાસને ધ્યાનમાં લઈ કહેવું યોગ્ય ઠરે કે જેને ભણવું છે, ડગલું ભર્યા પછી હઠવું નથી, તેને કદી કોઈ માધ્યમ નડતું નથી. આ વાસ્તવિક્તા છે. આપણે આપણી 'ગુજરાતી' માતૃભાષા વિશે જ વાત કરીએ તો ગુજરાતી ભાષા આર્ચકુળની ભાષાઓ સાથે સંબંધ ધરાવે છે. આર્ચવૃત્ત-ભારતમાં ભાષા અને વાણીનો ગુજરાતી ભાષા જેવો વિસ્તાર વિશ્વની ભાગ્યે જ કોઈ અન્ય ભાષામાં થયો હશે. વિશ્વફ્લક પર મીટ માંડીએ તો ગુજરાતી ભાષા આજે ગૌરવભર્યું સ્થાન જમાવી શકી છે. આધુનિક યુગની હરણફાળ ઈ-યુગમાં આજે ગુજરાતી ભાષા વિસ્તરી રહી છે. સૌને સાથે લઈને ગુજરાતી કેવા સ્પંદન વ્હેંચી રહી છે! એક ગુજરાતી તરીકે ગર્વ અનુભવતા કહેવાનું મન થાય કે 'હે ગુજરાત તને અભિનંદન છે.' અરે! મારી માતૃભાષાની મીઠાશ તો જુઓ, ''ખારા 'નમક' ને પણ તે 'મીઠુ' કહી સંબોદે છે!!!'

માતૃભાષાની અવગણના કે અવહેલના આપણા દ્વારા કદીચે થવી ના જોઈએ. જરૂર છે તો ફક્ત આપણે આપણી માનસિકતા બદલવાની. માતૃભાષા પ્રત્યે જાગૃતતા કે સભાનતા લાવવા કોઈકે તો પહેલ કરવી જ પડશે. આપણી માતૃભાષાનું સંવર્ધન કરવું એ આપણી નૈતિક જવાબદારી છે. ''માતૃભાષા એ તો સોનાની લગડી છે.'' આપણે સંકુચિત, સંકીર્ણ ન બનીએ. વિશ્વસાહિત્ય અને વિશ્વસંસ્કૃતિની દિશાઓના બધા બારી બારણાં મોકળાં રાખીએ પણ સાથે જે આપણી માતૃભાષા છે તેને અવગણીએ નહિ. 'ડુંગરા પૂજાએ, પણ ઉમરાને પૂજવાનું ન વિસરીએ'.



He became the Chief Minister of Gujarat for the first time in the year 2000-2001. This made him popular in the hearts of the people of whole nation which resulted in full majority of seats to the BJP during the 2014 election and Modi became the Prime Minister.

The people of India have great expectations from him. The first and foremost change he made was to make India corruption free. To make that happen he made different changes in the law. He reactivated the country's relations with different foreign countries and urged them to make investments in Indian economy.

He started different campaigns for the betterment of the country.
